

## CAFETERIA

Students are expected to conduct themselves in the school cafeteria in the same manner as would be required in polite society. Eating should be, and can be a pleasant social experience if all are cognizant of their responsibility to those about them. Unmannerly, rude, loud or boorish behavior cannot be accepted in the school cafeteria and has no place in any part of the school.

Our lunch periods are closed. This means a student remains in the cafeteria until the end of the lunch period. We wish this were not necessary. However, the student should remember that while one-third of the students are at lunch the other two thirds are in class. It is our desire to protect the learning situation for those in class that has caused us to adopt the closed lunch policy.

The lunch-room committee suggests the observance of the following rules during the lunch period:

1. Always stand in line and wait your turn. Do not crowd around the cashiers.
2. Know what you want and ask for it immediately.

3. Take your seat daily, at the regular customary place.
4. While you are eating your lunch, be concerned only with those directly at your table. Never throw paper or any other article about the cafeteria—This is a must.
5. Students at each table are responsible for the following:
  - a) One student will place all dishes used at the table on his tray and will place the tray with all dishes on the moving belt.
  - b) A second student will place all silver used at the table on his tray and will place the tray with all silver on the moving belt.
  - c) A third student will gather all paper bags and other paper articles on his tray and will empty all paper in the receptacle designated for paper. These receptacles are in the wall on either side of the moving belt. The tray will then be placed on the belt.
  - d) It is the responsibility of each student to make sure that the table at which he sits to eat his lunch is completely clean and ready for the next lunch before he leaves the cafeteria.
6. No foodstuffs shall be carried from the cafeteria. This includes all items of food including pretzels and crackers.
7. We have an unusually attractive and pleasant school cafeteria. It is the responsibility of each student to do all in his power to maintain a pleasant atmosphere and to keep the cafeteria clean and neat. The atmosphere of a good school cafeteria is the same as that found in a fine restaurant.

8. No books should be taken into the cafeteria. Students should place books on the built-in shelves outside the cafeteria before entering the same. Books are not to be left on the shelves after the cafeteria period. Books found on the shelves outside the cafeteria area at the close of the school day will be placed in Lost and Found.

If we all follow these simple rules, we will make our cafeteria one which we will enjoy and one of which we shall be proud.
